- 2) Rabies Cases:
 - a. There have been 2 reported cases of rabies in the county. On 02/06/25 and 05/15/25 2 bats that were found in La Marque came back positive for rabies.

3) Events/programs:

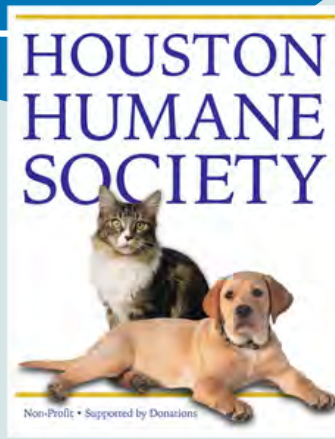
- a. **Adoption Specials:** From January through September, the ARC consistently hosted adoption specials, ranging from \$10–\$40.90, for puppies, adult dogs, and all animals. These specials were offered almost monthly, sometimes multiple times per month, to encourage adoptions and reduce shelter capacity. All made possible by the ARC's Sponsor a Heart donation fund. Regular adoption fee is \$85.00.
- b. **Volunteer & Service Projects:** Students, corporate teams, and interns volunteered at the ARC throughout the year. Groups from Lorraine Crosby Middle School, Top Golf, Marathon Petroleum, and the Gulf Coast Center helped clean kennels, walk dogs, bathe animals, and prepare bags of pet food for the shelter pet food pantry, adoption goodie bags, providing both manpower and community connection.
- c. **Festivals & Public Outreach:** The ARC participated in large community gatherings such as the Pet Palooza in La Porte, the Texas City Art Festival (where shelter dogs created and sold artwork), the Kemah Boardwalk Bark-a-thon every other Sunday in May, and the Haak Winery Adoption Event. These opportunities brought visibility and connected adoptable pets with potential families.
- d. **Major Adoption Collaborations:** In August, the ARC participated in large-scale efforts, including the nationwide Tractor Supply Adoption Event and the Mega Adoption Event sponsored by Petco Love. At the Mega Adoption event, more than 50 pets found their forever homes in one weekend.

4) Media releases:

- a. **Public Awareness & Safety Messaging:** The ARC regularly issued posts to inform the community, including pet safety tips during extreme cold climates, spay/neuter awareness on World Spay Day, and storm-related care reminders. We also promoted programs like the 72-hour Adoption Trial and Borrow a Dog to encourage adoption and enrichment.
- b. **Low-Cost Vaccine Clinics:** From February through August, the ARC consistently hosted low-cost vaccine clinics, promoted on and with Bulletin Board, Daily News, and all GCHD social media platforms. These clinics run every month, providing vital care access for pet owners.
- c. **Adoption & Foster Promotions:** The ARC frequently highlighted their longest residents, encouraged fostering, and boosted adoptions through national holidays like National Pet Day. Special posts asked the community to help foster and transport animals, expanding support for shelter pets. The ARC held a Foster Rally Orientation to boost our foster program and recruit new members. This will be an event that we will continue to promote.
- d. **Volunteer Recruitment & Appreciation:** Multiple posts were dedicated to strengthening volunteer involvement, including "Volunteer Now" and "Transport Volunteers Needed." The ARC also gave shout-outs during Volunteer Appreciation Week to thank those already serving.

- e. **Community Engagement Shout-outs:** The ARC publicly recognized partners and supporters, such as GCHD employees for Employee Appreciation Day, ACOs for Animal Control Officer Appreciation Week, and the Texas City Fire Department for providing animal enrichment.

- 6) ARC Updates
- a. Apr 4th & July 3rd—The ARC partnered with the Houston Humane Society where we provided 8,360 lbs. of pet food, served 184 households, and 756 pets within our community.
 - b. July 28th-Aug 1st-- Operation Kindness, Animal Alliance, Bay Area Pets Adoptions, SNIP of League City, and Second Chance Pets, all non-profit organizations, sponsored nearly 100 spay/neutered surgeries with the assistance of the SPCA of Brazoria County in preparations for the Mega Adoption event at the NRG Arena.
 - c. We continue to increase our rescue partnerships and strive to increase our live release outcomes. Since Jan 1st we have had 690 animals transferred into rescue. In addition to increasing our live release rates, we post “Stray of the day” on Facebook and Instagram to bring exposure to animals found as strays. We are also posting lost pets that have been found by citizens and kept safe with the finder while reunification efforts are being made to find the owner. We have achieved sending rescue pleas for every animal in our care to our rescue partners as an added effort to increase our live release rate.
 - d. September 2024, the ARC executed a cruelty seizure rescuing 4 cats from deplorable conditions of cruelty and removed an estimated 60 deceased animals, most of them being cats at a residential property in San Leon. We worked with the Houston SPCA who assisted with seizing one dog and an emaciated horse from the property. Today, it brings immense joy to report that each animal has found a forever family, thriving, and flourishing in environments filled with love and care. This case resulted in criminal prosecution.
 - e. September 2024 the ARC seized 9 aggressive dogs from a residential property in unincorporated Santa Fe, these aggressive dogs were killing and destroying people’s pets, livestock and property. This case gained a lot of media attention from all local news agencies, and the ARC was able to resolve the issues in favor of public safety.

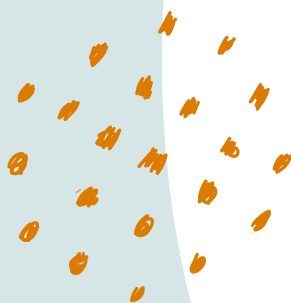
- f. In December 2024, the ARC supported efforts to contain the Avian Influenza Virus by collecting specimens in the field and conducting welfare checks on individuals potentially exposed in our county. There was one confirmed case of Avian Influenza recorded in Texas City.
 - g. We continue to work with non-profit organizations for assistance in sponsoring services for ARC pets. (Sterilization, pet food, medical supplies and equipment)
 - h. We continue to make efforts with assisting with owner surrender intervention and rehoming, lost and found pets, and posting impounded animals via social media daily. Since Jan 1st, we provided rehoming resources to 491 citizens, 819 animals, and kept 784 animals out of the shelter. We also aid citizens with resources to retain their pets; social media posts looking for fencing fixtures, kennels, doghouses, and assistance with medical care.
 - i. The ARC would like to thank the Bingo Boot Kickers Charity Fund/Animal Alliance for the use of funds to support the discounted adoption programs, bingo black and senior adoptions.
 - j. We are continuing to report all ARC building maintenance needs to county maintenance for the upkeep of the ARC.
 - k. The ARC would like to thank ARC Pet Allies for their support and help towards the shelter needs and our animals.
